Our clients often struggle to understand the importance of proper designation of the named insured in insurance policies. Unfortunately, insurance professionals often also struggle with this! This session will focus on the CGL Coverage Form and the BAC Coverage Form with emphasis upon the insuring agreements and definitions of "you" and "insured" found in each coverage form. A review of endorsements used in the CGL to provide insured status to those who are neither named insureds nor automatic insureds (commonly referred to as additional insured endorsements) will reveal that they may not do what the additional insureds think they do! A review of symbols used in the BAC will reveal the importance of "autos deemed as covered autos" in the form - and who is afforded coverage for those "autos".
